2) Secure your grip with both hands, holding at the pastern 3) Gently and slowly apply slight pressure- Do not torque or force by stretching this way  
4) Hold for 10 - 15 seconds (can be increased over time) being cautious to horse's comfort 5) Release and praise horse 6) Conduct 3 repetitions on each leg
